BACKGROUND

MAXCAP features a nine-partner consortium of academic and research centres from all over Europe which investigates the consequences of current and future EU enlargements for the Union's internal and external integration capacity. The project is funded under the European Union's Seventh Framework Programme for Research (FP7). MAXCAP aims at producing policy recommendations on how to maximize the EU's integration capacity with respect to enlargement and the neighbourhood policy, including specific policy tools and options. During the lifecycle of the project MAXCAP partners attend various policy briefings/seminars targeted at local experts from EU member states, candidates and neighbours. These briefings and seminars will not only give the chance to disseminate MAXCAP's academic and policy-relevant results but also to get feedback on the research findings and their relevance from local practitioners and academics.

The public expert round table "The European Neighbourhood in Perspective" is organized by MAXCAP in cooperation with Ilia State University.

OBJECTIVES

- Provide a platform for the review of the EU's integration tools and strategies and their
 political and socio-economic impact on Georgia and the South Caucasus, as well as to
 encourage the discussion of fresh ideas and approaches to the subject
- Identify and discuss policy-relevant lessons that can be drawn as regards the EU's future integration strategies
- Bring visibility to the European Union and raise the awareness on its engagement in the Georgia and the South Caucasus
- Strengthen interaction and cooperation among Track II initiatives in the region and linking the contributions that Academia and Civil Society Organization can make to the EU integration of Georgia and the South Caucasus

PARTICIPANTS

Decision-makers and leading members from the central administration, parliament and political parties; academia, civil society organizations, think tanks and media; as well as representatives from the EU Delegation and other European institutions and diplomatic representations in Georgia.

The Conference Language will be English.

Public Expert Round Table, Tuesday, October 7, 2014

The goal of the expert round table is to discuss policy relevant aspects of issues that touch upon the following questions: To what extent can the EU's policy towards the Eastern partnership countries be characterized as a success or a failure? Does the EU lack a convincing strategy towards its Eastern neighbours and if yes, why? How does the EU effect political and economic change in the Eastern Partnership countries if compared to enlargement and what explains the difference? How do we assess the role of the EU in the current crisis in Ukraine and how can we explain its performance?

A key goal of the expert seminar is to facilitate a discussion between local experts from the South Caucasus and MAXCAP researchers about the role of the EU in the region and factors shaping its capacity to shape political and economic domestic change. Local experts are invited to assess the validity and relevance of MAXCAP's research findings in terms of policy-relevant lessons.
